Roman Catholic Word of the Week

Nullity. A decree or judgment by a competent ecclesiastical court that a reputed marriage is invalid and hence no marriage was contracted in the first place. Even when entered in good faith, an invalid marriage requires that it be dissolved or regulated by revalidation. The chief ground for nullity is the proved absence of free consent to enter a permanent marital union according to the teaching of the Catholic Church. Since the Second Vatican Council, local bishops have been given jurisdiction over many nullity cases, previously reserved to the Holy See. (Etym. Latin *nullus*, none, not any.)

Open Book Quiz

Dear friends, the purpose of apologetics is to clear up misconceptions that block many people from accepting doctrines taught by the Catholic Church to be true. For example, a great majority of non-Catholics (and many Catholics) believe that contraception use is okay even though the Church says it is wrong. Apologetics is useful to show what the Church teaches on any given issue and why such teachings are not up for grabs.

I have attempted to explain Church teaching on many subjects over the past four years. It is now “Let’s Take A Quiz” time. In the space below, please try to answer, as best you can, common objections leveled against the Church as error. I will offer my responses to these questions in my next offering.

1. Many of our Protestant brethren decry our use of *Father* when we refer to our priests using Matt. 23:9 as the basis of this belief. Jesus says in Matt. 23:9 “Call no man your father on earth, for you have one Father who is in heaven”. They claim therefore that Catholics are engaging in an unbiblical practice that Jesus forbid. Are they correct? Why or why not.

2. There are many people within and without the Church who believe women can and should be priests in the Catholic Church. After all, the church has been in a vocation crisis for many years. Therefore, this crisis can be resolved simply by ordaining women because more “ordinations” will reduce the crisis. Is this a correct statement or not? Why or why not.

3. Protestants claim the Bible is the only rule of faith i.e. Sola Scriptura (Scripture Alone) is the only rule of faith. The whole of Christian faith is found only within the Bible’s pages. Therefore, anything not contained in the Bible is both unnecessary and wrong thus hindering one’s coming to God.

Catholics claim this view is actually repudiated in Scripture itself. Catholics believe the true “rule of faith” to be Scripture **and** Apostolic Tradition.

4. Have you been saved? Fundamentalists and Evangelicals believe they have absolute assurance that all they have to do is “accept Christ as their personal Lord and Savior” and they are saved. Once one accepts Jesus as his personal savior, there is nothing you can do that will forfeit your salvation. “No wrong act or sinful deed can ever affect the believer’s salvation” Is this thesis correct? If “yes” why; if “no” why.

Friends, I leave you with this note: you probably know more about our Catholic Faith than you think. Try to answer these questions as best you can; a prayer to the Holy Spirit will truly help immensely. God Bless us every one.

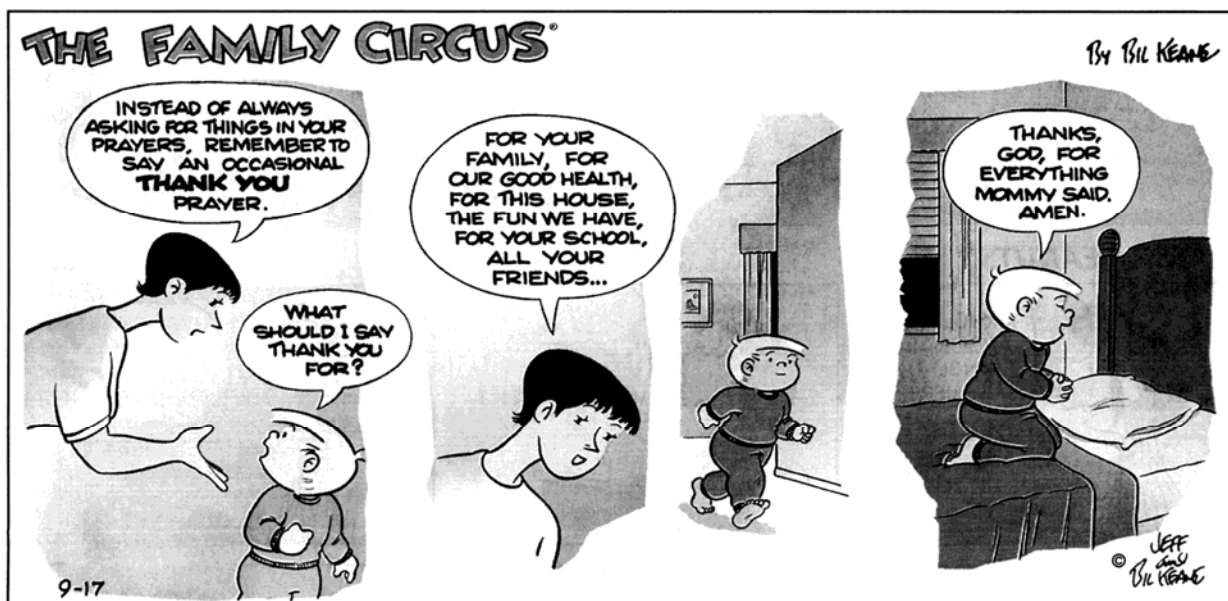

The Constitution of the United States

Article I

Section 4.

The times, places and manner of holding elections for Senators and Representatives, shall be prescribed in each state by the legislature thereof; but the Congress may at any time by law make or alter such regulations, except as to the places of choosing Senators.

The Congress shall assemble at least once in every year, and such meeting shall be [on the first Monday in December,] (Note: Changed by section 2 of the Twentieth Amendment.) unless they shall by law appoint a different day.

Section 5.

Each House shall be the judge of the elections, returns and qualifications of its own members, and a majority of each shall constitute a quorum to do business; but a smaller number may adjourn from day to day, and may be authorized to compel the attendance of absent members, in such manner, and under such penalties as each House may provide.

Each House may determine the rules of its proceedings, punish its members for disorderly behavior, and, with the concurrence of two thirds, expel a member.

Each House shall keep a journal of its proceedings, and from time to time publish the same, excepting such parts as may in their judgment require secrecy; and the yeas and nays of the members of either House on any question shall, at the desire of one fifth of those present, be entered on the journal.

Neither House, during the session of Congress, shall, without the consent of the other, adjourn for more than three days, nor to any other place than that in which the two Houses shall be sitting.
